Second Sunday in Easter

"Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name." John 20 verses 30-31

We live, as the Chinese proverb puts it, in interesting times! We live in post Resurrection times as the final verses of this Sunday's gospel reminds us. We are reminded of our own humanity and frailty as we recall the words of Thomas as he demands proof of Jesus' rising. He is, unfairly in my opinion, called Doubting Thomas. Perhaps he should be redefined as Questioning Thomas, because I think we can all associate ourselves with him.
